This list includes books and articles on British and Irish settlement between the fifth and fifteenth centuries, published in 2019, 2020 and 2021, with the works of each year separately recorded. The bibliography is focussed on the Group's specialism of medieval rural settlement. It includes publications deriving from archaeology, place-names, geography and history. It does not attempt to cover works in social, economic, cultural and agrarian history and place-name studies unless they feature settlements. Archaeological work on towns, castles, cemeteries or religious sites, or on artefacts or environmental evidence, are not included, except those explicitly connected to rural settlements.
